

Teaching London: LDBS SCITT COOKIE POLICY

1. Cookies

You should note that cookies may be used on this website. Cookies are small pieces of information stored by your browser on your computer's hard drive. Cookies are used to keep track of your use of the website and provide you with customised content.

By modifying your browser preferences, you have the choice to accept all cookies, to be notified when a cookie is set or to reject all cookies. However, you should be aware that if cookies are rejected you may not be able to use some of the online application processes provided by this site.

Some cookies that we use are exempt from the regulations and we do not ask permission before adding these to your device. These cookies are used for the purpose of maintaining choices you have made. For example whether to hide or show an element of the website such as the slideshow.

If after reading this, you continue to use the Teaching London: LDBS SCITT website without any amendments to your settings, we will assume you're happy to continue receiving all cookies on our website.

2. What is a Cookie?

A cookie is a piece of information in the form of a very small text file that is placed on an internet user's device storage. It is generated by a web page server, which is basically the computer that operates a web site. The information the cookie contains is set by the server and it can be used by that server whenever the user visits the site. A cookie can be thought of as an internet user's identification card, which tells a web site when the user has returned.

Session Cookies

Session Cookies are stored in the device memory only during a user's browsing session and are automatically deleted from the user's device when the browser is closed. These cookies usually store a session ID that is not personally identifiable to users, allowing the user to move from page to page without having to log-in repeatedly.

Session Cookies are never written on the device hard drive and they do not collect any information from the user's device. Session cookies expire at the end of the user's browser session and can also become no longer accessible after the session has been inactive for a specified length of time, usually 20 minutes.

Stored Cookies

Stored Cookies are stored on the user's device and are not deleted when the browser is closed. Permanent cookies can retain user preferences for a particular web site, allowing those preferences to be used in future browsing sessions.

Permanent cookies can be used to identify individual users, so they may be used by web sites to analyse users' surfing behaviour within the web site. These cookies can also be used to provide information about numbers of visitors, the average time spent on a particular page and generally the performance of the web site.

Third Party Cookies

Third Party Cookies are not set directly by the company website, but by third-party providers. Third Party Cookies may be set by providers whose services or functionality is embedded in Teaching London: LDBS SCITT website. This includes Facebook.

Cookies Used on Teaching London: LDBS SCITT Website

Teaching London: LDBS SCITT website use Google Analytics to analyse the use of this website. Google Analytics generates statistical and other information about website use by means of cookies, which are stored on users' device. The information generated relating to our websites is used to create reports about the use of the websites. Google will store and use this information.
